

DFAL Golf Outlook

Unlike years past, there doesn't appear to be one dominant team that will run away with the Diablo Foothill Athletic League (DFAL) golf championship. Miramonte, Campolindo and Acalanes each have strong teams and are early favorites to claim the league title. A quick overview will set the scene for the season ahead.

Miramonte

Since 2003 the Miramonte Matadors have dominated the DFAL, cruising to a 63-4 record in league matches. They are looking to defend last season's DFAL title, but must do so without four of their top six golfers from a year ago. On this list are current college golfers Greg Palm and Bryant Williams, who graduated from a team that finished 16-0 in league play and placed 13th at the North Coast Section Championships.

Under the guidance of coach Jerry Montgomery, the Matadors are off to a quick start with a 3-0 record as of March 11, but they have hardly blown opponents away. They narrowly escaped Las Lomas on March 6 with a two-stroke win, and their other two matches have been decided by nine strokes or less.

This year, the Matadors are led by junior captain Scotty Williams, a first team All-DFAL selection player who helped Miramonte knock off Acalanes with a match-low 38 at Orinda Country Club last year. He then fired a one-over 37 against Northgate on March 8.

Sophomores Cole Speers and Mario Paoletti have assumed roles in the starting lineup after seeing limited time their freshman seasons. Speers has been a consistent performer early on with a 40.8 stroke average while Paoletti is getting experience playing in the first group with Williams. The Matadors are also getting contributions from fourth year lettermen Talores Nevares, who fired a 41 against Las Lomas to save the Matadors from potential a defeat.

Miramonte has endured the early part of the season without junior Jack Fernbacher, whose broken collarbone has kept him out of the game. Fernbacher has one of the most legendary short games in high school golf, and is hoping for a mid March return.

Acalanes

Although they finished the regular season in third place behind Miramonte and Campolindo, the Acalanes Dons outplayed their conference rivals in last year's North Coast Tournament of Champions in Fortuna and finished the season on a high note. They look to carry some of that momentum into the new season.

The Dons got off to a quick start with a 206-260 thumping to defeat Concord on February 21. Junior Brandon

Caldwell led all golfers with a one-over 37, and freshman Ian Fisher fired a 38 in his first varsity match.

The following week Acalanes traveled to the challenging Orinda Country Club looking to make it two straight. Spencer Blodgett notched a 39 in wet conditions, but it wasn't enough because the Matadors triumphed 214-223.

In his own words, Acalanes Coach Tim Scott commented on the season saying that "Looking at the few scores around the league, it just doesn't look like there is one dominate team." He went on to say, "I look for it to be a battle between ourselves, Miramonte, Campolindo, Las Lomas and Northgate."

Acalanes' top golfers are Blodgett, Caldwell, Fisher, Michael Warren and Jack Sullivan, a second team All-DFAL selection last year.

"There hasn't been one player who has really jumped out yet," Scott said. "This week we play two matches, and after that we should have an idea of who's playing the best."

Acalanes has yet to play a home match at Rossmoor Golf Course, but that will change this week as the Dons host College Park and Las Lomas in a dual-match on Wednesday, followed by a home match against Northgate on Friday.

Campolindo

The Campolindo Cougars head into the new season without current St. Mary's golfer and two-time DFAL MVP Dan Cone, but they still have a legitimate chance at winning the league title thanks to a deep and well-rounded lineup.

Campolindo is coached by Steve Robinson, who is in his fourth year at the helm. The Cougars' starting six at this point consists of senior Ben Marshall, juniors Alex Berber, Jack Middlebrook, Ben Alexander and Justin Goldberger, and freshman Bjorn Kallerud.

"We're a good team," Kallerud said. "We were picked to finish third in league, but we are better than that."

The Cougars are off to a 1-0 start after destroying Concord 205-282 on March 7. Kallerud led the field of golfers with a two-over 38 at Moraga Country Club. His round consisted of back-to-back birdies on holes 5 and 6 after he started the round with a couple of bogeys. Middlebrook (41), Marshall (41), Goldberger (42) and Alexander (43) rounded out the top five.

The Cougars host Acalanes on April 12 before they travel to Rossmoor GC the next day to battle the Dons. Either match could ultimately decide the league championship.
