Lomas attends Campolindo High School, where he is a choir member and

active in school musicals. He has played water polo for four years and received the coach's and most inspirational award. Wilson's Eagle service project benefits Joaquin Moraga Intermediate School where he built nine birdhouses for large vermin-hungry birds.

Gamsky is the third Eagle Scout in his family. His service project benefits Rheem School in Moraga, where he remodeled a garden area by planting trees, flowers and adding bark cover and a new bench.
