Local tennis players offer lessons to benefit Meals on Wheels

In response to COVID-19, Campolindo High School sophomore Jake Hammerman founded Impactful Tennis, an organization where four varsity tennis players from local schools give tennis lessons to kids aged 7-13 with lesson fees going directly to local nonprofit, Meals on Wheels Diablo Region.
