## **Social Climbers**

Getting out of my car, the perfume emanating from my garden smells more like being inside the cosmetic department at a store. Flowing over my front gate and arbor, the jasmine is thick in its wondrous white wardrobe. Bees are buzzing as the intoxicating fragrance fills the air. A robust climber, the blooms from this gregarious vine are one of the most sought-after scents to make expensive perfumes and flavored teas. But jasmine has a dark side: it can be invasive. It grows so vigorously that it can strangle trees, shrubs, and flower beds. Wherever a stem touches the ground, a new vine will root. Jasmine thrives in sunlight and the blossoms prefer to face the sun. Keep it pruned and under control, or you may find that it will take

over your landscape.

Climbers, vines, or plants that climb have specialized structures that allow them to ascend and cling to surfaces for support. I love many of them and you may also.

What are a few of the most popular climbing plants besides jasmine?

Clematis

Wisteria

Passionflower

Nasturtium

Clematis is renowned for its beautiful blooms, long-flowering with a plethora of colors, shapes, and climate exposure. There are over 300 species and hundreds of hybrids.

Wisteria vines produce romantic cascades

of fragrant pendulous blossoms in lavender, pink, and white that resemble bunches of grapes. Their vigorous vining capabilities require a very sturdy structure.

Passionflower is delicate and exoticlooking, climbing with tendrils on trellises, encompassing more than 400 species. Headyperfumed flowers appear on new growth as pollinators flock to the garden.

Trumpet vine, native to Eastern North America, boasts trumpet-shaped flowers that attract hummingbirds in glorious shades of red, pink, scarlet, purple, and yellow.

Grapevines are perennial plants producing delicious fruit for eating, wine, jams, and juices. They are a climbing vine requiring a support system to allow the fruit to hang.

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
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



### Half Bath Makeover

In 1966, The Mamas and The Papas released their first album, "If You Can Believe Your Ears". In addition to a couple hit songs, the album created a stir with its cover art, a picture of the four musicians together in a bathtub next to a toilet. In 1966, the toilet was considered in poor taste, and the cover art was modified in subsequent releases to conceal it.

Does your home have a half bath, possibly in poor taste? Maybe it just needs a little cosmetic update? Remodeling even a small half bath triggers a multitude of design considerations. I am frequently asked: "How much would it cost to re-do that bathroom?" The answer is: Do you have a budget or a design in mind? You may either budget to meet your design or design to meet your budget.

A client recently asked me to replace the cracked toilet in his half bath. Unfortunately, the sink cabinet included a countertop that extended in one continuous length across the back wall of the room and over the toilet tank. New toilets are taller and don't fit under that shelf. My client is now considering an update to the whole bathroom. He is in the essential design phase. A complete design helps prevent unnecessary costs like buying components that don't fit, or painting walls that you later tear down.

There is an expression for situations where work begins before the design phase is completed: "Ready, Fire, Aim". The following are suggested design decisions for your project. They will help you plan (aim) before

you start construction (fire).

My client's remodel started with needing a new commode. Here is a good example of an opportunity to spend a little or a lot. The price range varies for even a basic toilet. If you are coveting that heated Toto Washlet Bidet seat, it will double the price of the toilet (verses a regular seat) and you will need to add a GFCI outlet near the toilet. Does your half bath require the bidet? If it is a frequent stop for you and the family, maybe so. If it is for company only, maybe not.

If you want to replace a sink cabinet with a pedestal sink, you will probably want to rework the supply valves and even possibly the drain to position them directly behind the narrow pedestal column; add the labor expense to your budget accordingly. If you are simply replacing a cabinet and sink counter, there are many cabinets that come with the countertop and sink combined. One very desirable sink feature to look for is an overflow hole. This is a single hole or slot near the top of the sink which allows water to drain from a plugged sink before it runs over the top and floods the bathroom floor. It is important to verify this, since not all sinks come with this overflow feature.

If you are thinking of installing or removing a recessed medicine cabinet, there is framing, patching, and painting required. Backlighted mirrors are becoming more popular but will require electrical work to install (Ka-Ching!).

Are you changing the floors? You will want to pick out your new flooring to complement your cabinets and wall color. Hardwood flooring in a bathroom can be damaged by water; if you like the look of wood, the new laminates do an excellent job of imitating wood and are more water resistant. Also look at imitation wood-grained ceramic tiles - they are 100% waterproof.

Plan to buy new a faucet. You can try to re-use the existing faucet and drain from your old sink in your new countertop, but older fixtures don't always disconnect cleanly. Now this is very sad to write, but despite how popular they are, the color-coated fixtures of gold, black, bronze, antique brass, or white lose their luster in

about five years. Unless money is no object, you'll regret getting them when you pay to have them replaced. If you want a finish that lasts, get chrome or brushed nickel fixtures.

Peripheral expenses to anticipate are lights, mirrors, towel bars, toilet paper holders, a fan, and cabinet knobs. Prices can range dramatically depending on the quality and style. I recently installed a TP holder with a cell phone shelf attached on top - convenient for multitasking during your contemplative time.

The materials and labor for your bathroom update can be basic or expensive, depending on your tastes. Control of the budget requires planning, defining the scope of your project, and sticking to that scope.

Careful planning helps avoid the Ready, Fire, Aim syndrome: rework delays and budget overruns. After reading this article, you may be asking yourself if you have the DIY bug this badly. That's a good time to consult with a professional to help with the design.

My Rieber grapevines (Vitis Vinifera) which I grew from canes my dad gave me from our ranch years ago have used my crabapple tree as a trellis. Fall is fun when the tree is filled with bunches of blueblack grapes hanging from the branches.

Climbing Roses can drape over a wall, sprawl along a fence, train up an obelisk, or swirl up a tree. In my yard, my two favorite climbers are the thornless, white Lady Banksia rose, which cohabitates with my plum and chestnut trees, and the delightfully fragrant Lady of Shallot in shades of apricot and pink that covers a fence.

Nasturtium is a delicious edible plant with a zesty, peppery flavor. Flowers with bold colors of yellow, red, and orange trail and climb.

#### **Popular Climbers NOT to plant:**

Honeysuckle Morning Glory

As beautiful as honeysuckle and morning glory are, they can also be incredibly invasive - displacing native species, producing dense mats of foliage, and covering trees, fences, or any item in their path. In some settings, they increase the erosion of the soil while reducing biodiversity. I remember my first visit to Bermuda thirty years ago, where I was mesmerized by the giant and glorious sky-blue flowers that covered everything everywhere. When I asked about the "magnificent morning glory", my comment was met with disdain. "This is a nuisance plant," I was told. Just as bindweed is a troublemaker in our gardens, controlling morning glory is a challenge. The "easy-to-grow" or "no-fail" honeysuckle called "Hall's Prolific" is marketed to new gardeners, but these are invasive species. ... continued on Page OH10

The non-invasive honeysuckle, from the genus Diervilla, is native to North America and an essential part of our ecosystem, providing food for native insects. If you want honeysuckle, plant Diervilla. As a selfadherent aerial plant, ivy is an aggressive climber that can wreak havoc on structures, buildings, walls, and trees. Highly flammable, ivy harbors rodents and is extremely difficult to eradicate. These three specimens are what I call the "anti-social climbers". Delete them from your mostwanted list.

Why do you want to include climbing plants in your garden design? The reasons are numerous and desirable.

Vertical Interest: Climbing plants allow for more dynamic and layered landscapes as we look up.

Climbers can cover arbors, trellises, fences, pergolas, and walls, adding depth and texture.

**Space Optimization:** Climbing plants are space-savers, especially for small gardens or urban settings where space is limited. Because they grow vertically, they make efficient use of space while making a big impact.

**Privacy and Screening:** This may be one of the best reasons for growing climbers. By growing up, they provide a natural privacy barrier, offering seclusion with the added benefit of beauty and, most often, fragrance. Aesthetic Appeal: With their beautiful cascading flowers, foliage, or fruit, climbers create a lush and romantic atmosphere.

Wildlife Habitat: Biodiversity is established in the garden as most climbers attract birds, butterflies, bees, hummingbirds, and other pollinators. They offer food, shelter, and nesting sites for various creatures which contribute to a healthy ecosystem.

Versatility: Vines, creepers, scramblers, and climbers can be trained to grow in diverse directions and on several structures to customize landscapes.

Other than nasturtiums, all the climbers require heavy-duty, solid support structures to grow and flourish successfully. If you want to keep the climbers "social", it is necessary to prune, maintain, and be watchful, or else they will land in the "anti-social" profile. With careful management and thought, climbers will add beauty, functionality, privacy, and ecological benefits to your garden. Enhance your outdoor space with spectacular social climbers reaching great heights with the right support.
